Our target goals this year are: St. Therese - \$2,581.00; and St. Boniface - \$5,162.00. I have once again placed a "thermometer" on the Website so we can track our progress. The following information comes from the figures of those pledges that have been made and processed through our parish office as of Monday, January 29th: **St. Therese:** \$1,230 pledged (47.6% of target), by 8 individuals (20% of parishioners), with an average gift of \$153.75. **St. Boniface:** \$655 pledged (12.6% of target), by 7 individuals (7% of parishioners), with an average gift of \$93.57. Thanks for your commitment, and for your sacrifices!
